# Monterey Bay Academy Important Holiday / Home Leave Information

Monterey Bay Academy has **SIX** Holiday/Home Leave breaks during the '23-'24 school year. Parents or Guardians will be responsible for their students for the entirety of each break. Please take note of the dates and start times of each break and make your travel plans accordingly. Students should **NOT** miss classes due to travel without pre-approval from the MBA Administration.

# Holiday / Home Leave '23-'24 dates:

MBA offers student transportation to San Jose International Airport (SJC - 1hr from MBA), San Jose Train Station, and the SJC In-n-Out parking lot for local pickup. Students needing transportation to San Francisco International Airport (SFO - 1 1/2 hrs from MBA) must submit a special request to the Transportation Dept. and extra fees will apply.\*

All transportation requests are coordinated through the Transportation Department. Send your travel information to: transportation@montereybayacademy.org For airport transportation, student must sign up in the Business office at least 1 week before Home Leave and provide their flight or travel itinerary information.

# **Transportation Schedule for Home Leaves**

### MBA Departure and Drop off Times:

- San Jose Train Station 1:45pm
- SJC Airport 2:00pm
- SJC In-n-Out Parking Lot 2:15pm
- SFO Based on Student's Flights\*

### **MBA Return and Pick up Times:**

- San Jose Train Station 7:00pm
- SJC In-n-Out Parking Lot 7:15pm
- SJC Airport 7:30pm
- SFO Based on Student's Flights\*

## **Airport Transportation Fees Information:**

- Round-trip to and from SJC airport for on time sign up **\$50**
- One-way trip to or from SJC Airport for on time sign up \$30
- Round-trip to and from SFO airport (INT Flights) for on time sign up \$150 or actual cost of shuttle\*
- If no prior arrangements have been made as indicated above \$50 additional fee will apply
- School transportation makes plans to arrive at San Jose International Airport by 2pm on Home Leave days, and will pick up at San Jose International Airport by 7:30pm on the last day of Home Leave.
- All Flights/transportation arrangements must be made for no earlier than 3:00pm flights on Home Leave day and students should return late afternoon or evening of the return date no later than 7:30pm.
- If your transportation needs are before 3pm (leaving) at the beginning of a Home Leave or after 7:30pm (returning) at the end of a Home Leave, You must make a special request with the Transportation Office. Extra fees will apply. A \$50 fee each way will be apply for flights with times that have not been approved.
- \*San Francisco pickup and drop-off will be based on student Flights. ECI will coordinate SFO transportation or a shuttle service will be used. Students should purchase Flights according to the time schedule listed below and get approval before purchasing.
- Check Out Students must leave campus before 5:00pm on the day Home Leave begins. (Cafeteria will **not** be open for dinner)
- Check In Students need to return between the hours of 1:00pm and 10:00pm on the Final day of Home Leave. The dorms will not be open before 1:00pm. If, due to emergency, you will be later than 10:00pm, you must contact the Dean to make arrangements. (Cafeteria will not be open for lunch or dinner)

# Home Leave Details:

- The dormitories and cafeteria are closed during the Home Leaves. Students may not stay in the dormitory.
- All reservations for airport transportation are made through the Transportation Office.
- Notify the Transportation Office immediately of any transportation changes.
- Make arrangements for school transportation at least one week prior to each Home Leave. Additional fees will apply for last minute arrangements.
- **Transportation arrangements at times other than the regularly scheduled leaves are discouraged.** All requests for special needs must be submitted to the Principal at least two week prior to the Home Leave. Extra fees will apply. Transportation arrangements should **not** be scheduled for unusual hours.
- Students must sign out on Leave cards with the deans.
- Falsifying Leaves will result in disciplinary action.
- Students may NOT stay in Hotels without Parents, may NOT take Ubers on or off campus, may NOT travel alone (except home) without a guardian, parent or approved adult & may NOT leave campus with anyone that has not been approved by the deans or Principal.
- If a student wishes to go to any home other than his/her own parent or guardian, his/her parent or guardian must give written permission to the dean prior to the Home Leave. A written contract must also be made with the dean by the host family prior to the Leave. The same is true if a student uses any transportation other than commercial or school transportation.
- Any time parental permission is granted the parent or guardian must send written permission.

# **MONTEREY BAY ACADEMY\_WHAT TO BRING**

- 1. Bible
- Bedding—At least One pillow; two sets of sheets (extra-long twin mattress); pillow cases; blankets, comforter
- 3. Toiletries & shower basket with handle
- 4. Bath & Hand towels + wash clothes
- 5. Bathrobe, flip flops for shower
- 6. Soft-soled slippers
- 7. Study lamp
- 8. Studying/school supplies
- 9. Battery operated alarm clock

- 10. Wastebasket
- 11. Cleaning supplies & equipment for cleaning mirror, sink, counter, and floor in room—bring your own broom/dust pan
- 12. Laundry detergent (liquid) & softeners (if needed)
- 13. Command strips to hang things on the wall
- 14. Wall décor (Fire code allows one to cover up to 25% of any wall in your dorm room)
- 15. Drinking glass for room & water bottle for school
- 16. Sleeping bag
- 17. Hangers
- 18. Umbrella

### Clothing based on the Monterey Bay Academy Handbook.

- a. School clothes
  - i. T-shirts, Polos, & blouses
  - ii. Slacks/Jeans with no rips, tears, or holes, shorts to the mid-thigh, skirts to the knee or below
  - iii. Sweatshirt / Jacket (no hoodies during classes)
  - iv. Shoes, sandals, boots
  - b. After School Dorms/Cafeteria
    - i. Athletic/sweat pants
    - ii. Yoga pants or Leggings
    - iii. Modest swimwear / One piece women swimwear
    - iv. Pajamas
- c. PE/Recreation time
  - i. Workout/jogging attire
  - ii. Non-marking athletic shoes
- d. Weekend programs / Church Services
  - i. Guys: Button down shirt, Tie, nice slacks, dress shoes; suits (optional for banquets and church services)
  - ii. Girls: Skirts and dresses to the knee or below, dressy pants, dress shoes
     (No midriffs should show when bending over or reaching , All straps need to be approximately three finger widths wide,
     Dress fronts should NOT allow cleavage to show, Dress backs should stay above the bra strap line)

**ROOM FURNISHINGS**: Student rooms should reflect the character and style of the student. At the same time they are to uphold MBA values by not displaying anything that devalues race, gender, religion, human life or lowers moral standards. Use 3M Command strips (no nails) to hang things on the wall. Rooms are equipped with 2 twin beds that can be bunked, 2 dressers, 2 desks, and window blinds. No additional furniture will be allowed into the dorm rooms. You may bring area rugs.

**APPLIANCES:** Dorm fridges up to 33" in height are acceptable. Hair dryers and curling irons are allowed as well as hot pots and rice cookers with an enclosed heating element. No electrical blankets, toaster ovens, coffee makers, microwaves, or hot plates with an exposed element are allowed. Each room is provided with heat, so no other heating apparatus is allowed.

**TECHNOLOGICAL DEVICES:** It is a privilege at Monterey Bay Academy for students to have a technological devices in their room and students should know that this privilege can be revoked at any time at the discretion of the dean. To maintain your possessions, have respect for others by using headphones to keep your music to yourself and do not allow your grades to slip so you don't have to hand over

your devices. Devices NOT allowed: TV's, game consoles (Xbox, Wii, etc), stereos with large speakers. All of your possessions should uphold MBA values and standards; inappropriate material is subject to confiscation.
